

Minutes of the Meeting for the 10th Board of Trustee Meeting, District Mineral Foundation Trust, Sundargarh on 31st August, 2023 under the Chairmanship of the Collector cum Chairman & Managing Trustee, DMF Sundargarh

The 10th Board of Trustee Meeting of DMF Sundargarh, was held under the chairmanship of the Collector-cum-Chairman & Managing Trustee, DMF Sundargarh on 31.08.2023 at 11.00am at Sadbhabana Bhawan, Collectorate Campus, Sundargarh. The Chief Executive Officer-District Mineral Foundation, Sundargarh had communicated to all Trust Board members and Special invitees vide letter no: 1561/DMF, dated: 23.08.2023 intimating to attend the Board of Trustee meeting. The attendance of the members of the Board of Trustee, DMF-Sundargarh and the special invitees are placed at the Annexure-I.

At the outset the Collector-cum-Chairman & Managing Trustee DMF Sundargarh welcomed all the members and directed the CEO-DMF, Sundargarh to carry forward the meeting as per the agenda. With the Chairman's permission, the CEO-DMF, Sundargarh introduced herself and the Team members of the firm Ernst and Young LLP, a newly engaged agency, for managing of the Programme management Unit (PMU) of DMF, Sundargarh. The Members raised concern over onboarding of the firm E&Y-LLP for the PMU; the CEO-DMF,

Sundargarh made it clear that proper RFP was floated and through open competitive tender process, the selection of the firm had been made. Thereafter, the CEO-DMF took the meeting forward as per agenda of the meeting.

The CEO-DMF informed the members of the committee that on 31st July, 2023 the status of fund position was as follows:

The DMF, Sundargarh has had a total accrual of ₹ 6639 Crores, out of which ₹ 7731 Crores has been sanctioned for projects, which is about 116.7% of the total accrual; and the expenditure is around ₹ 5163 Crores, which is about 77.76% of the total accrual. The DMF, Sundargarh is currently over-sanctioned; but still intends to make a total sanction of 150% of the total fund accrual towards projects approval, in line with the instructions issued by the Planning & Convergence Department, Government of Odisha vide letter no: 10401(13)/P of the Joint Secretary to Government dated: 18.09.2021. During the current Financial Year 2023-24 (up to 31st July, 2023), a total amount of ₹ 457.14 Crores has accrued to the accounts of DMF Sundargarh and thus total accrual of about ₹ 1204 Crores expected. The CEO-DMF informed the members about the sector-wise and agency-wise details of the project. The detailed is at Annexure-II for reference.

2. The CEO-DMF informed the members of the committee of the revised strategy towards management and operation of DMF:

i. **Strengthening of Projects:**

The CEO-DMF highlighted that currently more than 6000 projects have been sanctioned out of DMF, of which around 1400 projects are ongoing. There is a need to ensure continuity and delivery of quality services for critical projects, such as Provision of Ambulance, Provision of Advanced

Rehabilitation Centre etc. DMF will strengthen the projects by leveraging the reach of the Line Departments and ensuring strong legal backing to the projects as per departmental guidelines with provision of necessary manpower support to the Line Departments out of DMF Contingency Funds. Further, in view of the high quantity of projects sanctioned under DMF and in order to ensure quality of implementation, there is a need to augment the capacity of works departments for implementation of civil infrastructure projects. Thus, it is proposed to engage Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) such as WAPCOS Ltd, NBCC LTD, NPCC Ltd, EPIL, OSIC, OBCC etc on nomination basis, as per applicable under provisions of the General Financial Rules.

ii. **Streamlining of Projects:**

The CEO-DMF stressed the need to leverage the existing institutional capacity of the Line Departments and the requirement of mapping the DMF interventions with the concerned Line Departments.

The CEO-DMF briefed the members that clear and transparent process for sanction of projects and release of funds to the Executing Agencies have been set up as per the guidelines of the Planning & Convergence Department, Government of Odisha. Training to Line Departments on the process for sanction and release of funds for projects, to speed up with the time required for the processes has been imparted and refresher trainings will be taken up as per requirement.

The CEO-DMF informed the members of the Board that the Annual Report and the Audit Report for the Financial Year 21-22 has been prepared and submitted to the Board, while Audit Report for the Financial Year 22-23 is ongoing and will be submitted soon after completion.

iii. **Sanctioning of Projects:**

The CEO-DMF stated that currently there are 536 sanctioned projects amounting to a total sanctioned cost of ₹ 667.94 Crore, the detailed list for the same is placed at Annexure-III. Further, for 219 projects revised approval is required, amounting to a total revised sanction cost of ₹ 1593.19 Crore; the detailed list for the same is at Annexure-IV. Also, as a part of the plan for implementation, in the upcoming year the DMF is looking to implement 51 new projects amounting to around ₹2498.92 Crore, the sector wise details for the same is as follows:

The detailed list of new projects is placed at Annexure-V.

The CEO-DMF informed the members of the Board that the contingency expenditure under DMF is placed at Annexure-VI for perusal and approval of the Board.

All the projects are placed before the members of the Board of Trustee for their approval.

The members of the Board of Trustee appreciated the strategy proposed under DMF and unanimously provided approval for the strategy as well as all the projects put forth before them.

1. The Collector-cum-Chairman, DMF Sundargarh informed the members of the Board of Trustee that in order to improve retention of students at the secondary school level, the Project to provide entitlements under Right to Education Act (specifically free textbooks and MDM) to secondary school students enrolled in Government and Government Aided schools of Sundargarh district has been approved under DMF. Under this project, around 12,321 school students of Class 9th and 10th, who are currently not being covered under similar existing schemes by the Education Department, will be benefitting through the project for FY 2023-24 which will incur a cost of around ₹1,01,99,838/- (Rs One crore one lakh ninety-nine thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight only). As the school session has already started and students have purchased text books, for this current academic year students will be reimbursed for their textbook purchased; the School Management Committee will oversee the purchase from next year onwards for, so all secondary students get free textbooks at the time of enrolment. DMF Sundargarh aims to reduce drop-outs through this initiative. The members of the Board appreciated the initiative and as a token of inauguration sets of Class 9th and 10th textbooks were provided to the school students by the members of the Board.
2. The Heads of the Line Departments briefed the members of the Board of Trustee regarding the status of the projects being implemented under DMF.
 - i. CDM&PHO:

The CDM&PHO, Sundargarh briefed members that currently there are 126 projects with a total sanctioned amount of ₹ 644.93 Cr with a total expenditure of ₹ 532.03 Cr (82.49%). The CDM&PHO, Sundargarh informed the members that around 88 different projects have been completed while the rest are ongoing. He further briefed that as per the approved strategy of DMF, Sundargarh revised agreements/ tenders shall be processed for the following projects, also, till the time the revised tenders are floated there is a need to provide extension to the already existing projects so as to provide uninterrupted critical services which have been placed for the approval of members of the Board of Trustee, DMF Sundargarh:

 1. Provision of Ambulance service in different Health Institutions
 2. Provision of Mahaprayan vehicles in different Health Institutions
 3. Provision of Mobile Medical Unit Vans in different locations
 4. Provision of Blood Collection Van in different locations
 5. Provision of Solar Water heaters in different Health Institutions
 6. Provision of Doctors in different Health Institutions
 7. Provision of increment of salary of doctors () deployed under DMF based on experience (more than 3 years), educational qualification (MBBS, Specialization) and satisfactory performance as decided by the committee headed by the CDM&PHO, Sundargarh
 8. Provision of Paramedics in different Health Institutions
 9. Provision of operation and management of Therapeutic Service Center at Sundargarh and Rourkela in the district
 10. Provision of 20 Block Level IPU's in the district
 11. Provision of Matrujyoti Kit to pregnant mothers
 12. Provision of travel support to patients affected from Sickle Cell Anemia
 13. Provision of Matrujyoti project to ensure ANC for pregnant mothers
 14. Provision of Maa Gruhas for ensuring institutional and safe delivery of high-risk mothers

The members of the Board of Trustee appreciated the status of projects under DMF and unanimously provided approval for the projects put forth before them.

ii. R&B, Sundargarh and R&B, Rourkela:

The R&B, Sundargarh briefed members that currently there are 156 projects with a total sanctioned amount of ₹ 402.53 Cr with a total expenditure of ₹ 250.38 Cr (62.20%). R&B, Sundargarh informed the members that around 145 different projects have been completed while remaining 11 projects are ongoing. Regarding R&B, Rourkela currently there are 114 projects with a total sanctioned amount of ₹ 387.42 Cr with a total expenditure of ₹ 336.70 Cr (86.9%). Out of this around 108 different projects have been completed while remaining 6 projects are ongoing. As per the approved strategy under DMF, in order to augment the capacity of the department, technical support staff have been deployed in the R&B, Sundargarh through the Works Department which are paid for through administrative contingency of the sanctioned projects under DMF. Major ongoing projects under DMF:

1. Improvement to Duduka-Gopalpur-Toparia Road (MDR) to 2-Lane with paved shoulder (Phase-I)
2. Widening and strengthening of Bhasma to Zinc Nagar
3. Construction of H.L. Bridge over Nakti Nallah
4. Construction of modern record room at Collectorate
5. Construction of H.L. Bridge over River IB at 1st Km on Sundargarh-Rajpur Road
6. Construction of Old Age Home under DMF at Sundargarh
7. Construction of 60 Bedded Capacity Attendant Rest Shed at DHH Sundargarh
8. Construction of proposed H.L. Bridge over River Koel at Rourkela (Jamunanaki)
9. Construction of H.L. Bridge over Sasa Nallah
10. Construction of H.L. Bridge over Godapalli Nallah

The members of the Board of Trustee appreciated the status of projects under DMF and unanimously provided approval for the projects put forth before them.

iii. RTO, Sundargarh and RTO, Rourkela:

The RTO, Sundargarh on behalf of both the Regional Transport Officers briefed members that currently there are 3 major projects with a total sanctioned amount of ₹ 92.11 Cr. As per the approved strategy under DMF, in order to augment the capacity of the department, technical support staff have been deployed in the R&B, Sundargarh through the Works Department which are paid for through administrative contingency of the sanctioned projects under DMF. RTO, Sundargarh informed the members that major ongoing projects under DMF are as follows:

1. Infrastructure Development at Black spot location to reduce accidents and including 5-year operation and maintenance along with provision of police patrolling vehicle and support staff
2. Proposal to expand the project for Infrastructure Development at Black spot location to reduce accidents and including 5-year operation and maintenance along with provision of police patrolling vehicle and support staff to uncovered areas in Hemgir Block and other critical locations cross the district
3. Refresher training for HMTV drivers of Sundargarh district
4. Supply & Installation of Solar Blinkers in different location of Sundargarh district

The members of the Board of Trustee appreciated the status of projects under DMF and unanimously provided approval for the projects put forth before them.

iv. RWD Sundargarh and RWD Rourkela:

The RWD Sundargarh on behalf of the two RWD divisions briefed members that currently there are 80 projects with a total sanctioned amount of ₹ 187.55 Cr with a total expenditure of ₹ 129.52 Cr (69.05%). RWD Sundargarh informed the members that around 69 different projects have been completed while

remaining 11 projects are ongoing. Similarly, there are 187 projects with a total sanctioned amount of ₹ 490.77 Cr with a total expenditure of ₹ 315.77 Cr (64.34%). RWD Rourkela informed the members that around 164 different projects have been completed while remaining 23 projects are ongoing. The major ongoing projects under DMF are as follows:

1. Widening and strengthening of road from Darlipalli to Dhumamunda via Kalamegha
2. Construction of road and CD works along with HL Bridge over Safei Nallah at SH-10 to Mukundapur road
3. Construction of PMGSY road from Gundiadihi to Dhangergudi border, GP- Gundiadihi
4. Construction of road from telendihi to bendojharia
5. Construction of road and CD works from Ghoghia to Kacharu
6. Construction of Bridge on the river from Chatta Purunatola to Dudugatola road
7. Construction of long approach road & Bridge over Lubrakhaman Nallah on Tukuda to Chaliabahal road

The members of the Board of Trustee appreciated the status of projects under DMF and unanimously provided approval for the projects put forth before them.

v. PA ITDA Sundargarh, PA ITDA Panposh and PA ITDA Bonai:

The PA ITDA Sundargarh on behalf of the three ITDAs briefed members that currently there are 99 projects with a total sanctioned amount of ₹ 129.93 Cr with a total expenditure of ₹ 60.29 Cr (46.40%). Out of this, 74 different projects have been completed 3 projects are ongoing and remaining 22 projects have been cancelled. Regarding, ITDA, Bonai currently there are 134 projects with a total sanctioned amount of ₹ 84.57 Cr with a total expenditure of ₹ 28.04 Cr (33.16%). Out of this, 47 projects have been completed 71 projects are ongoing and 6 projects have been cancelled. Further for ITDA Panposh currently 52 projects with a total sanction amount ₹ 51.48 Cr and a total expenditure of ₹ 34.79 Cr (67.58%). Out of this, 42 projects have been completed and 10 projects are ongoing. The major ongoing projects under DMF are as follows:

1. Construction of 150 seated boys hostel at Illa Memorial Panchayat Samiti Higher Secondary School, Kinjirma
2. In order to provide benefits of Government schemes to forest villages, conversion of different forest villages to revenue villages in all blocks of Sundargarh district under Forest Rights Act
3. Construction of 200 seated Boys Hostel at Kinjirkela College, Balisankara
4. Construction of 200 seated Girls Hostel at Kinjirkela College, Balinsankara
5. Construction of 4 nos of additional classroom in Girls Educational Complex
6. Construction of AWC building at Balisuda in Lahunipara Block
7. Construction of EMRS Lahunipara in Lahunipara Block
8. Construction of AWC building at Belpara in Dumerjore GP, Kuarmunda
9. Construction of 6 nos of toilet and 1 no of hostel building PSH, bathroom with toilet

The members of the Board of Trustee appreciated the status of projects under DMF and unanimously provided approval for the projects put forth before them.

3. Hon'ble Zilla Parishad Member Lahunipara (KHA), & Ex-Officio Member, Smt. Sushila Nayak highlighted the need of boundary walls in Health Institutions.

The Collector-cum-Chairman, DMF Sundargarh instructed the CDM & PHO, Sundargarh to make an assessment and suggest appropriate interventions at the earliest.

4. Hon'ble MLA, Rajgangpur Assembly Constituency & Ex-Officio Member, Dr. C.S. Raazen Ekka requested the Collector-cum-Chairman, DMF Sundargarh to plan out intervention to improve the air quality of the mining

affected areas. Further the Hon'ble MLA, Rajgangpur requested the CDM & PHO, Sundargarh to identify the diseases prevalent in the mining affected areas of the district due to the mining impact and suggest suitable interventions for the mitigation.

The Collector-cum-Chairman, DMF Sundargarh instructed the CDM & PHO, Sundargarh and the concerned Line Department to make an assessment and suggest appropriate interventions at the earliest.

5. Hon'ble MLA, Biramitrapur Assembly Constituency & Ex-Officio Member, Shri Shankar Oram highlighted the need to identify new interventions to improve agricultural output, and initiate steps for upgradation of Higher Secondary Schools and Degree Colleges from DMF.

The CDO-cum-EO, Zilla Parishad, Sundargarh informed the Board that under the College Transformation Project, the Government of Odisha all Government Higher Secondary and Degree Colleges of Sundargarh district will be taken up for upgradation and provision of Smart Class, furniture and other equipment; and DMF is supporting with funds for the same.

6. Hon'ble MLA, Sundargarh Sadar Assembly Constituency & Ex-Officio Member, Smt. Kusum Tete suggested for projects to improve rural-urban connectivity by expanding Mo-Bus services and improve services in Old Age Homes in the district by providing necessary requirement. The Hon'ble MLA also requested to provide details of Skill Training Centres and the courses operational therein under DMF support for dissemination of information to the common public.

The Collector-cum-Chairman, DMF Sundargarh informed the Hon'ble MLA that bus connectivity scheme is under consideration of the Government Odisha, and instructed the concerned agencies (ZP, Sundargarh/ RWD Sundargarh/ DSSO, Sundargarh/ District Employment Officer, Rourkela) to initiate appropriate action for smooth implementation of the projects.

7. Hon'ble MLA, Bonai Assembly Constituency & Ex-Officio Member, Shri Laxman Munda suggested to provide special focus to the development of directly mining affected areas, especially consider the development of Bhutuda GP road and Bonai to Patamunda road and ensure display of transparency board with scheme details at the site of all projects taken up under DMF, Sundargarh.

The Collector-cum-Chairman, DMF Sundargarh instructed the Line Departments to put transparency board with scheme details at the site of all projects under DMF; and intimate the members of the Board at the time of foundation stone laying or inauguration of the projects to ensure transparency.

8. Hon'ble MP (Lok Sabha), Sundargarh Parliamentary Constituency & Ex-Officio Member, Shri Jual Oram stressed upon to complete the statutory audit of DMF for the pending financial year at the earliest. The Hon'ble MP stated that the proposals submitted by the Public Representatives should be considered for sanction; the Hon'ble MLA stressed upon that only after proper examination of permissibility and feasibility of the projects sanction is to be granted. Hon'ble MP requested the Collector-cum-Chairman, DMF Sundargarh to explore possibilities of partnerships with the Incubation Cell established at NIT-Rourkela and NSIC-Rourkela to promote skill training and entrepreneurship for the mining affected population.

The Collector-cum-Chairman, DMF Sundargarh directed the CEO-DMF and the District Employment Officer Rourkela to explore for possibilities.

9. The CEO, DMF informed the members of the Board that subsequent to the approval by the Board, the total value of projects sanctioned under DMF (₹ 10228.24 Cr) vs total fund accrued under DMF (as on 31st July, 2023) (₹ 6639 Cr), is around more than 150%, thus there is a need to prioritise completion of ongoing project before sanctioning of new projects. Further, the CEO, DMF informed that the Line departments have submitted

787 projects with a total cost of ₹926.61 Crore to the DMF, which is at Annexure-VII before the Board, for processing. However, in light of the above facts it was proposed that the proposals may be taken up for permissibility and feasibility study before sanctioning any further projects under DMF.

The members of the Board of Trustee, DMF Sundargarh unanimously agreed to send the proposals for feasibility study and subsequently the Collector-cum-Chairman, DMF Sundargarh directed the CEO-DMF to expedite the process for obtaining the feasibility of the projects which shall be placed before the Executive Committee and Board of Trustee for approval based on priority and availability of funds under DMF.

The Collector-cum-Chairman, DMF Sundargarh concluded the meeting by stressing that it is necessary to closely analyse and monitor the works being executed under DMF so that the benefits being envisioned are materialised for development of the common citizens.

The meeting ended with vote of thanks by CEO-DMF to all the members of the Board and Heads of Line Departments for their valuable inputs, actively contributing in the discussion and making the meeting meaningful.
